About our site: The 208 acre Fort Loudoun Historic Site is administered by the Fort Loudoun Historical Society, a registered 501c3 non-profit organization (est. 1975), with responsibility to tell the story of Fort Loudoun during its existence from 1756 to 1765.

The Fort: Venture to the fort and learn from its inhabitants about its history and use from 1756-1765.

Hell Town: Our blanket trading area, Hell Town, was the name given to Black's Town (today's Mercersburg) by its rowdy residents who were rebelling against British authority at Fort Loudoun during the Black Boy's Rebellion of 1765. The rebels posted proclamations of their rowdyism to provoke the fort's British soldiers. Skirmishes between colonists and soldiers occurred here 10 years before the American Revolution.

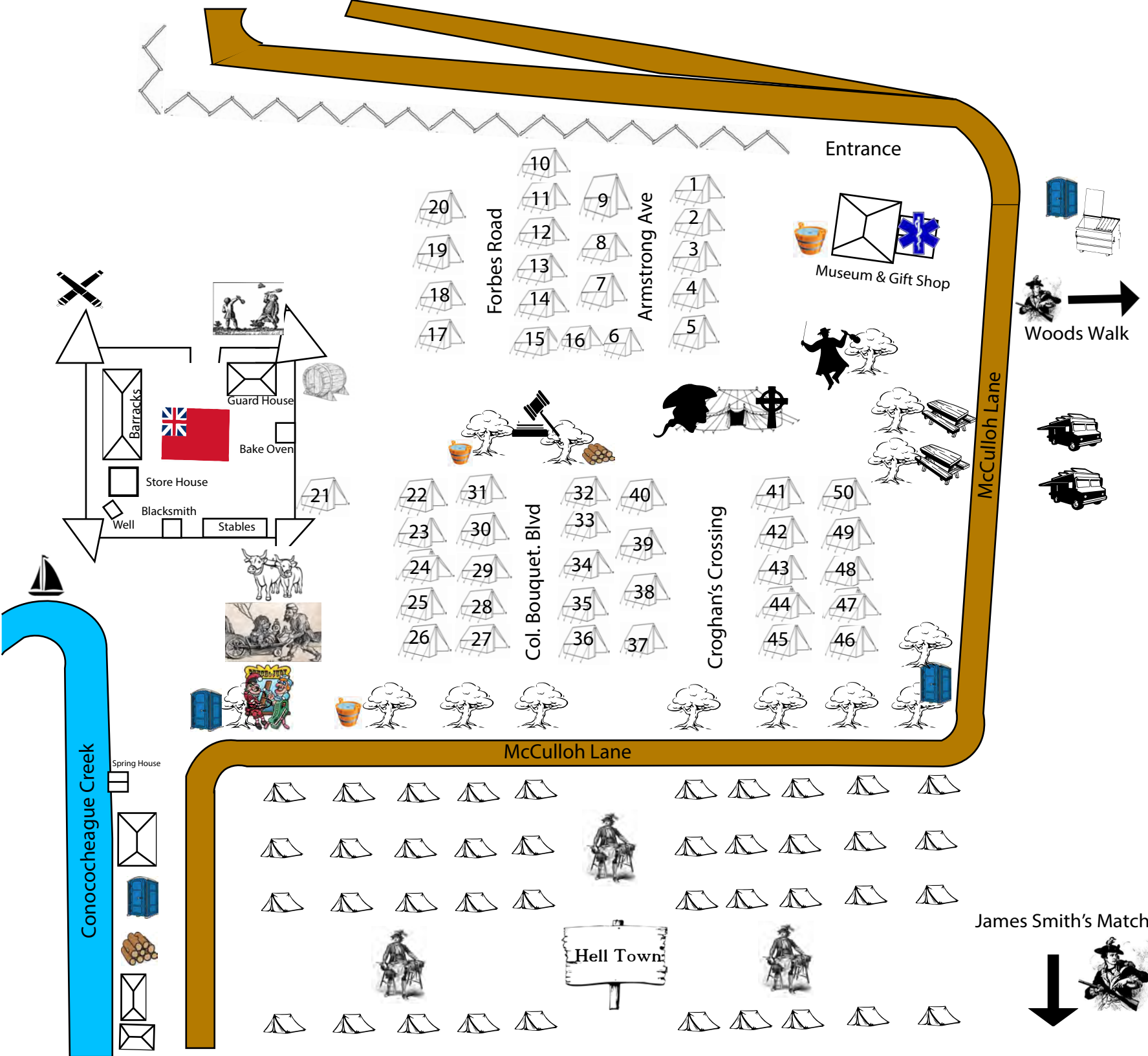
